Executive Summary and GSC Items for the GAC

GSC Formation

As discussed and agreed to at the spring 2011 GAC meeting, the Global Standards Council (GSC) has now been formed and has initiated pilot-phase activities. The broad purpose of the GSC will be to develop and maintain normative Global information sharing technical exchange standards. The criteria for inclusion in the resulting Global Standards Package are (1) inclusion in the Global Information Sharing Toolkit (GIST), (2) use of normative language for conformance, and (3) demonstration of an interoperability nexus for information sharing.

The GSC intends to conduct its activities using agile task teams and open a fully transparent collaborative process that will invite justice community participation from practitioners, industry, and the public. The GSC expects to request a formal charter as part of the Global Initiative at the spring GAC meeting.

The Global Infrastructure/Standards and Security Working Groups (GISWG and GSWG respectively) have realigned their group activities and affiliated work with applicable GSC task teams during this pilot phase. Those new GSC task teams are described herein.

GSC Task Teams and Objectives

Harmonization Task Team

Objectives:

- Complete outstanding Global Reference Architecture (GRA) developmental work.
- Identify and integrate all normative components and artifacts of the GRA, Global Federated Identity and Privilege Management (GFIPM), and technical privacy initiatives into a Global Standards Package (GSP).

Global Justice/Health Care Task Team

Objectives:

- Identify a process for standards interoperability between health community Information Technology (IT) and justice community IT initiatives.
- Identify use cases for the exchange of health and justice information.
- Identify and prioritize GRA services for the exchange of health information.

Federated Identity and Technical Privacy Task Team

Objectives:

- Continue work of the GFIPM Delivery Team.
- Continue development of the Technical Privacy Framework (TPF).

Services Task Team

Objective:

- Review and approve candidate GRA reference Service Specification Packages (SSPs). Seven of these specifications (listed below) are posted on the www.it.ojp.gov Web site and will be presented to the GAC for electronic approval throughout the remainder of this year and early 2012. The remaining four specifications were developed in Phase II and will soon be published for public comment.

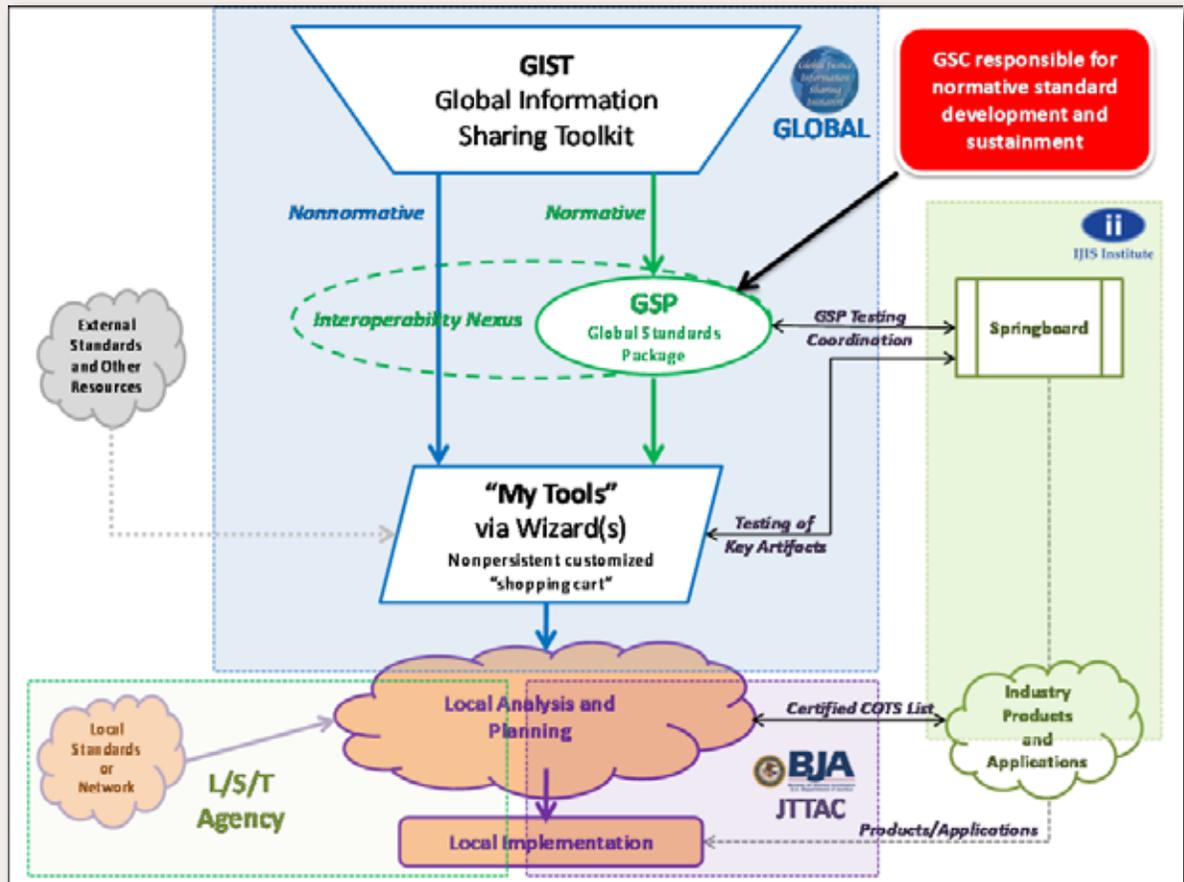
Organizational Model
